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## Lead Clinician end of the year message



As we come to the end of this year, a year of rebuilding, we would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your hard work in delivering high-quality phototherapy services to the people of Scotland. Thanks to your efforts we continue to see an increase in the number of phototherapy courses being delivered. It hasn't quite reached pre-pandemic levels but it is going in the right direction!

This year Photonet became 20 years old, which we celebrated at the annual meeting with a review of the achievements from UV phototherapy in Scotland.



As one of the first national networks in Scotland we have seen a near doubling of phototherapy centres in the past 20 years, bucking the global trend of reducing phototherapy. During these difficult financial times it is more important than ever to have a strong phototherapy provision. We estimate that UV phototherapy in Scotland is saving the NHS between £10 million and £20 million every year by reducing patients' use of emollients and delaying the introduction of expensive biologic drugs. At Photonet we feel very proud that the network has contributed to these achievements. We will continue to provide the community, the education, the data and the passion for this vital treatment and we look forward to another 20 years on this journey with you.

As always the Photonet team of Mhairi, Aneta, Louise and Iain have been working hard to ensure the network continues to progress and deliver on its objectives. I want to thank them for their enthusiasm and dedication to the network, they make the role of Lead Clinician a joy and an honour to undertake.

As we go into 2023 my tenure as Lead Clinician comes to an end with the network looking for fresh ideas and a new perspective from an interested individual. I would highly recommend putting yourself forward for this role which I have enjoyed and which has taught me so much over the past 4 years.


### Photonet 2022 Annual Meeting recording now available on TURAS Learn

# Photosys Upgrade



Long awaited changes have now been successfully implemented and **Photosys** launched on Monday 20 December 2021. Please check our <u>Guide</u> to familiarise yourself with the changes introduced. Here are few highlights:

- Location names have been updated (there is no longer Argyll & Clyde board) and Orkney and Western Isles added
- Removal of Health Board restrictions (you are now able to view your patient's treatment history regardless of where they were previously treated)
- Changes to the new treatment summary page
- You can now capture delay in treatment
- Erythema (called 'painful erythema grade 3 or 4 only')
- Face shield it is now mandatory field
- · ALL fields within treatment record can now be amended

#### Skin cancer review changes

- This section has been updated to better identify if and when patients have been offered and attended skin review.
- There is also a new area within Photosys to identify (tag) patients who should be recalled for skin review who may not currently be captured through the annual audit
- There is also the function to highlight patients who have been identified for skin review who should no longer be recalled
